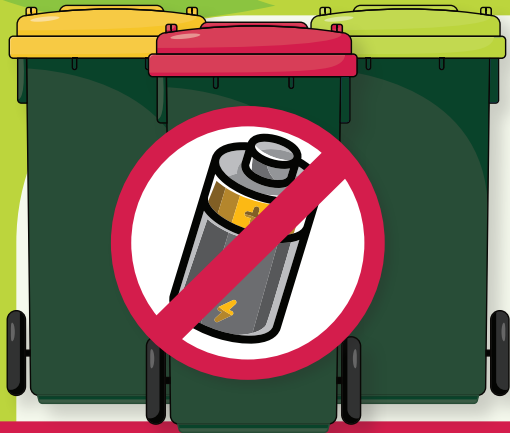


# Your Batteries Need Extra Care



Batteries of any size, shape, or form **MUST NOT** be placed in your household recycling or garbage bins.



## Batteries are a Fire and Environmental Hazard!



More than 450 fires in Australia have been linked to lithium-ion batteries over the past 18 months!

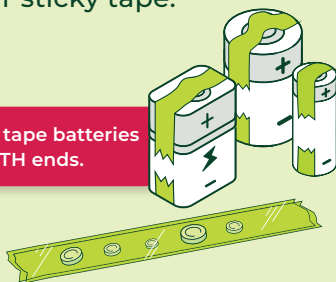


Batteries need extra care, and safe recycling involves a little first-aid and taping up your batteries.

## Steps to help you SAFELY RECYCLE YOUR BATTERIES:

- 1 TAPE** the terminals of used batteries to prevent sparking. Always use clear sticky tape.

Safely tape batteries on **BOTH** ends.



- 2 STORE** used batteries in a clearly labelled glass or fire-resistant container and make sure the container is not airtight as pressure can build up.



Keep this container in a cool, dry place, away from heat sources like stoves and out of reach of children and pets.



- 3 DROP OFF** batteries at a Battery Recycling Location near you. Storing them no longer than six months in your home.

✓ **COMMUNITY RECYCLING CENTRES** accept multiple battery variations.

✓ **MOBILEMUSTER** accepts all mobile phones, their batteries, and accessories.

✓ **B-CYCLE** accepts rechargeable, household & button batteries, as well as removable batteries; from power tools, digital cameras and e-bikes.
